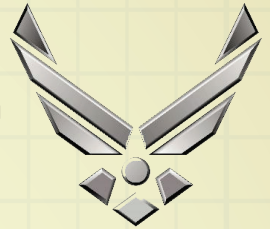

RESTRICTED REPORTS

Filing a restricted report will not initiate an investigation



SPECIAL VICTIMS' COUNSEL

A lawyer is dedicated to represent the victim in legal proceedings



EXPEDITED TRANSFER

The victim may be transferred upon request and in the best interests of the Air Force



NON-RATED PERIOD

Victims with significant difficulties may elect to have a non-rated period



NON-MEDICAL ESCORTS

Victims may have an Air Force-funded escort to trial and testimony for emotional support
