RESTRICTED REPORTS

Victims choose whether to initiate an investigation



SPECIAL VICTIMS' COUNSEL

A lawyer is dedicated to represent the victim in legal proceedings



EXPEDITED TRANSFER

Either the victim or subject may be transferred for their protection



NON-RATED PERIOD

Victims with significant difficulties may elect to have a non-rated period



NON-MEDICAL ESCORTS

Victims may have an Air Force-funded escort to trial and testimony for emotional support

CONFIDENCE IN COMMAND

SEXUAL ASSAULT CAN BE PREVENTED

98%

of Airmen believe their chain of command takes sexual assault reports seriously

97%

of Airmen believe their chain of command would take steps to protect the safety of a person making a report of sexual assault

95%

of Airmen believe their chain of command would take corrective action to address factors that may have led to a sexual assault

94%

of Airmen believe their chain of command encourages victims to report sexual assault

92%

of Airmen trust their chain of command would forward a report of sexual assault to criminal investigators

92%

of Airmen feel their chain of command creates an environment where victims feel comfortable reporting sexual assault
