The goal is to stimulate organizations to integrate effective mentoring strategies and processes into their initiatives and to ultimately promote mentoring in the United States.

### Why is Mentoring Important?

- Mentoring provides the opportunity for Airmen to maximize their full potential by encouraging their personal and professional development.
- Mentoring is transformational and facilitates the development of Airmen by sharing expertise, values, competencies, perspectives and attitudes.
- Mentoring is a unique and satisfying experience for a mentor to be able to help a mentee achieve his or her goals.
- Mentoring is an essential ingredient in developing well-rounded and competent leaders because it helps prepare them for increased responsibilities.

### What Tools Does the Air Force Offer in Support of Mentoring?

Airmen can access mentoring tools through MyVECTOR, an information technology platform offering a broad range of self enrichment tools. The platform supports individual Airmen by:

- Inviting participants to sign up as a mentee or serve as a mentor
- Allowing the selection of mentors based on preferences
- Providing a space for mentors/mentees to communicate online
- Offering a mentorship plan for developing goals and objectives

Airmen can also reference AFMAN 36-2643, *Air Force Mentoring Program,* which discusses mentorship guiding principles and also includes specific tools on how to find a mentor and build successful mentoring relationships.
