	Fall Prevention Focus Week
Priority Topic of the Week: Air Force Occupational Safety - Fall Prevention	For the fifth year in a row, in partnership with the Occupational Safety and Health Administration and the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health, the Air Force will host a Fall Prevention Focus week, 7-11 May 2018, highlighting ways to prevent falls and the preventable fatalities/injuries that accompany them.
	Over the past several years, the Air Force has made substantial progress reducing the severity of fall mishaps from 5053 in fiscal year 2013 to 2615 in FY17 for on-duty class A thru C mishaps. In FY 2017, non-sports related on- duty falls cost the Air Force over \$7.5 million. The largest category of these mishaps were slips, trips and falls accounting for 77 percent of the mishaps.
	During Fall Prevention Focus week, the Air Force Safety Center recommends commanders and supervisors hold informal meetings/discussions and conduct workplace reviews to evaluate potential risks in the work areas. Meetings should:
	 Be quick, informal and include open discussion regarding fall prevention
	 Address fall hazards, employee concerns, protective methods and Air Force fall prevention policies
	 Ensure everyone is aware of all mishap prevention requirements, have proper fall prevention equipment, training on the equipment use and to report any incidents/mishaps
