

Please note that some of the surveys and studies from which this data is drawn are conducted on a biannual basis and may have a significant delay before the release of data for the current school year. The below explains the steps we have taken to account for such delays.

• The latest academic year for which graduation rates are available on ED Data Express at the time of scoring was 2022-2023 and may be affected by the impact of COVID-19. To account for this potential impact, we have used the historical average from 2018 to 2021.

• Due to data release schedules, an accelerated final deliverable date for the SoMF report, and the time required to format data for usability the current scorecard utilizes previous years data from the Stanford Educational Data Archive (SEDA).
