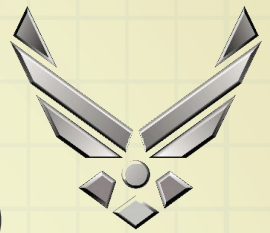

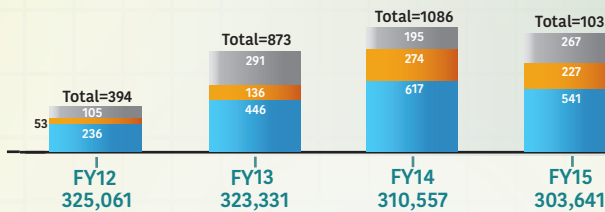
DEFINING PROGRESS

~3200 Active Duty Members Experienced Unwanted Sexual Contact in the past year

~2450 Active Duty Members Experienced Unwanted Sexual Contact in the past year

Progress is:

1. Narrowing the gap between prevalence and reported sexual assaults so we know Airmen are comfortable seeking help
2. A decrease in prevalence, indicating a decrease in incidents of sexual assault
3. Decreasing the time from assault to report

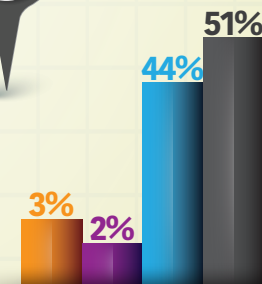
