June Triples the Joys of Summer Fun

June is the trifecta of outdoor fun, safety and education. Presidential Proclamations for June embrace "Great Outdoors Month," "National Safety Month" and "National Oceans Month." It's like we've been waiting for just this opportunity.

"With the winter we've had..." is often the lead-in for just about everyone talking about their summer plans. Almost always these plans include lots of time outdoors. Luckily, pursuing the great outdoors in one's own backyard or on the wild frontier just became easier and less expensive. Nearly 200 parks and recreational sites throughout the country are hosting free events on the 8th annual National Get Outdoors Day, Saturday, June 13, 2015, and they are <u>listed by state</u> on a single website. Encouraging healthy, active outdoor fun, federal agencies, nonprofit organizations and the recreation industry have teamed up to offer opportunities for American families to experience traditional and nontraditional types of outdoor activities (finally!).

"What I live for" is the theme of this year's National Safety Month and it is meant to encourage everyone to explore his or her passions – safely. Sponsored by the <u>National Safety Council</u>, (NSC) the website offers a variety of awareness and training opportunities, resources and injury prevention programs. On the flip side of their theme, NSC promotes the idea that Americans often worry about the wrong thing. To demonstrate this, there is a downloadable infographic titled "What are your odds of dying?" It pairs a variety of avoidable accidents with random occurrences and compares the possibility of death in each instance. For example, one's odds of dying as a result of a fall (1 in 144) is compared with one's chances of dying in a thunderstorm (1 in 6,780). This and five other paired examples illustrate the need to be aware of one's safety in a variety of everyday situations and to take the safest approach to everyday tasks.

"30 Days of Ocean" is the central idea behind the <u>National Ocean Service's month-long celebration</u> supporting coastal communities, promoting a robust economy and protecting coastal and marine ecosystems. There are nautical charts, mobile sites and apps and infographics, among other learning opportunities, to help the budding scientist of any age better understand and enjoy the world ocean.

June's appetite for fun, safety and education seems limitless. One might say that it's as big as all outdoors!

► THIS WEEK IN AIR FORCE HISTORY

June 4, 1997 – The Air Force reached a milestone in advanced missile propulsion with the successful ground testing of the Variable Flow Ducted Rocket (VFDR) at Atlantic Research Corp. in Gainesville, Virginia. A solid-fuel, ducted rocket engine, the VFDR increased the capabilities of conventional rockets by burning fuel-rich rocket-exhaust gases with air, thereby doubling or tripling the total energy produced by the engine.

June 5, 1981 – The KC-10 Extender completed qualification testing at Edwards Air Force Base, California.

June 6, 1975 – The last 16 B-52s at U-Tapao Air Base, Thailand, began their redeployment to the U.S.

June 6, 1944 – American and Allied aircraft flew approximately 15,000 interdiction, close air support, and airlift sorties in support of the D-Day invasion.

June 7, 1966 – The first successful launch of an Orbiting Geophysical Laboratory took place when OGO III went into orbit to perform 21 experiments, a record number for a U.S. scientific spacecraft.

June 8, 1911 – The Connecticut State Air Regulation passed and became the first state air law.

June 9, 1967 – The first O-2A Forward Air Controller aircraft arrived in Vietnam.
