- o Air Force requested top-line budget of \$120.4 billion for fiscal year 2017.
- o Strategic investment in innovative and advanced concepts leverages "leap ahead" technologies to maintain our competitive edge over adversaries.
- Investment in multi-role platforms for today's fight and future high threat environments.
- O Airmen represent our legacy and our future. Airmen are our secret weapon -- They always were, and always will be.

# • CSAF: Air Force update

- o Air Force flew about 1.7 million hours last year, which is 195 years of flying, 300,000 of those being combat hours.
- o Nearly 22,000 Airmen deployed around the globe every day.
- o The Air Force needs to go "back to the basics" with these 10 fundamentals for Airmen.
- o Airmen are key We need to fix where we know we are broken, stabilize, then figure out how to start filling in the holes in our Air Force that have been created by standing up new enterprises while we drew down the Air Force as a whole.

# **▶**THIS WEEK IN AIR FORCE HISTORY

March 3, 1986 – Tactical Air Command's first OT-37 Tweet replaced the Cessna O-2 aircraft at Shaw Air Force Base.

March 4, 2002 - During Operation Anaconda, the Air Force experienced its first combat deaths since the 1991 Gulf War. Two airmen died in helicopter assaults near Gardez, Afghanistan.

**March 5, 1985** - Through March 9, airlift crews flew 123 tons of food and medicine as part of four famine relief missions to Sudan, Niger, and Mali.

March 6, 1942 - The US Army Air School at Tuskegee, Alabama, for black aviators graduated its first class. The five black military pilots included Capt. Benjamin O. Davis.

March 7, 2003 - President George W. Bush issued an ultimatum giving Saddam Hussein and his sons 48 hours to leave Iraq.

March 8, 1944 - Eighth Air Force attacked Berlin with 623 bombers, escorted by 891 fighters.

March 9, 1955 - In an F-84F Thunderstreak, Lt Col Robert R. Scott set a three-hour, 44-minute, 53-second record for the 2,446-mile flight from Los Angeles to New York.
