- Every Airman who enforces professionalism in their workplace and insists their Wingmen treat each other with dignity and respect is taking action to eliminate sexual assault and support survivors.

- Understanding how to recognize opportunities for intervention is vital to stopping unsafe behavior, to include any form of retaliation.
- Leadership does not require rank or position. Any Airman can and should take action to lead their peers and set an example.

- Airmen are the heart of the Air Force—with them, the mission can't fail; without them, the mission can't succeed.
- Sexual assault can have devastating impact on an individual and also can severely impact a unit's ability and capability to perform its mission.
- A whole team, effectively preventing and responding to sexual assaults is critical to the health, morale and welfare of Airmen, and ultimately essential to Air Force readiness.
- Leaders must foster and encourage positive behaviors by recognizing acts that contribute to a supportive command climate.
- Commanders are charged with setting a professional atmosphere and enforcing the standards of conduct all times, while Wingmen are the foundation of restoring and establishing their unit climate and are vital to supporting victims of sexual assault.
- Eliminating sexual assault in the Air Force requires Airmen to be engaged all year not just in April. Airmen are the Air Force's best asset in preventing sexual assault.
