	 Virtual Training Work has begun on building a virtual training capability that will ensure spouses unable to attend traditional face-to-face training have access to initial key spouse training.
	 Sharing Success Stories We encourage KSP reps in A&FRCs to partner with their local public affairs offices to offer opportunities to share success stories and raise awareness about the how the program supports Airmen and their families.
	 Key Spouse Mentor Training Additional training has been developed to help provide clear guidance on the role of the KSM, to offer opportunities to share experiences and to foster relationships. This additional training can be accomplished virtually or face-to-face through the A&FRC.
	 Continuing Training Core List The KS working group expanded the list of core supplemental training available for volunteers that can serve as a baseline for installation training plans. Installations still have flexibility to offer community-specific training, as well.
	 Online Resource Library We are developing an online resource library as a companion to the virtual training that will include templates & resources for KS, KSM, and commanders.
	 Commander/First Sergeant Key Spouse Training The KSP will be incorporated into the required orientation content A&FRC Flight Chiefs provide to new commanders and first sergeants.
